ESPRIT, Dena Yago  
Tomorrow Gallery

ESPRIT is the title of Dena Yago's exhibition at Tomorrow gallery, as well as her new book of poetry. The exhibition, which employs the term ESPRIT in its multivalence, features high resolution scans of the following objects: nine capsules of Nordic fish oil, a Swiss watch, a Meyer lemon, a granny smith apple, a navel orange, two executive metal balls, Mûre et Musc perfume, a bottle of green tea, a rock in shades of grey, a rock in shades of brown, a rock with spots, a black stone with white edges, and five almonds. The exhibition also includes three metal folding chairs. The presentation of these works coincides with the release of Yago's ESPRIT, an extended poem published by Yesterday.

Dena Yago, born in 1988 in New York, received her undergraduate degree from Columbia University in 2010. She has most recently shown at Andrew Roth and Cage, both in New York. She is a producer of K-HOLE, a trend forecasting report that will be soon be releasing its second issue. She is currently based in New York.
